2024 RAIN BARREL PAINTING PROJECT

ENTRY GUIDELINES

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

All middle and high school students in Orange County Public Schools.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project is designed to educate and inform participants about the importance of water conservation while providing them with a practical way to save water and an opportunity to express their artistic talent by painting a rain barrel. The rain barrel(s) and acrylic paint will be delivered to your school. We suggest that students work in painting teams of a maximum of five per barrel. *Maximum number of barrels per school is two (NO EXCEPTIONS)*.

HOW TO ENTER:

- Submit a "Rain Barrel Painting Project Participation Form" (page 3) or digitally by <u>Friday, September 8, 2023.</u> This will guarantee that you receive the requested barrels for your school.

- Student artists will be photographed, awarded, and recognized at the Water Color Project Awards Ceremony in April 2023.
- Photographs of the winning barrels will be posted on the OUC—The Reliable One's website, as well as other media sources.

BASIS FOR JUDGING:

All painted barrels will be judged based on:

1-Originality 2-Effectiveness in Relaying Category Theme

3-Art/Media Technique
