TO KEEP WINTER FROM DRIVING UP UTILITY BILLS

Cooler temperatures might bring a much-welcomed respite from the Florida heat, but they also could drive up your utility bills. That's because it takes more energy to heat a home than it does to cool it. A lot more, in fact.

As winter approaches, OUC – The *Reliable* One wants to remind customers of five easy-to-follow tips to reduce energy consumption:

1 Set your thermostat at 68 degrees.
You use 11% less energy at this temperatures vs. 70 degrees.
Any degree lower than 68 will increase savings in your

- **2** Let the sunlight in. Pull back curtains and raise blinds to allow natural light to warm your home, and do the opposite when the sun sets.
- **3 Wear warm clothes indoors.** Put your shorts and T-shirts away and don sweaters and socks while at home.

4 Set ceiling fans to turn clockwise. Doing this will circulate warm air collecting near the ceiling.



5 Use portable space heaters.

They're effective for warming confined spaces like bedrooms and cost less to operate than heating the entire home. But be sure to keep portable heaters at least three feet away from furniture, bedding, walls, clothing and other flammable items.

HELPFUL TIP!

OUC's free Budget Billing service helps customers plan the amount they'll pay in monthly utility costs.

HOW IT WORKS:

Your monthly fixed amount is based on the average of your actual utility bills during the last 12 months, including electric, solid waste, and taxes.

* An additional percentage, at the discretion of OUC, will be added to the amount to prevent the deferred balance from growing too large.
