
PREPARE NOW FOR COLD WEATHER

Florida winter weather is here and OUC has tips to keep your family safe and help keep your bill under control.



BEFORE YOU PLUG IN YOUR SPACE HEATER KEEP THESE TIPS IN MIND

- Check Your Heater: Before each use, inspect all space heaters for loose connections, frayed cords or broken plugs – if you find any do NOT use.
- Follow the Three-Foot Rule: Keep space heaters at least three feet away from bedding, drapery rugs and anything that can burn.



- Always Unplug: Turn off and unplug space heaters and electric blankets when not in use.
- Avoid Extension Cords and Surge
 Protectors: Plug space heaters and electric
 blankets directly into a wall outlet to prevent
 overheating and electrical fires.

Other important tips to keep your family and home safe

FIREPLACES

- Make sure your chimney flue is open before using.
- Use a safety screen for protection from flames and embers.
- Never leave a fire or smoldering embers unattended.

CANDLES

- Use sturdy containers or holders and keep candles on solid surfaces where they cannot be knocked over.
- Never leave lit candles unattended.
- Keep candles away from trees, draperies, and other flammable items.
- Store candles and matches well out of children's reach.

SMOKE DETECTORS

- Check batteries regularly to make sure smoke detectors are working.
- · Replace batteries annually.

PROTECT WATER RESOURCES

- As temperatures drop below 32°, allow a trickle of water to flow through exposed pipes to prevent any water inside from freezing.
- For bathrooms or kitchen faucets that share exterior walls, also allow a trickle of water to flow through the pipe.
- Keep pool pumps running so they don't freeze.
- Cover exposed water pipes.



DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME CHECKLIST

As clocks "spring forward" on March 10, be sure to follow this twice-a-year household safety checklist.

Check or replace:

- ✓ Check/replace batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- ✓ Check/replace expired items in your first aid kit.
- ✓ Check/replace items in your hurricane/ emergency kit.
- Check fire extinguisher pressure and expiration date.
- ✓ Check/replace burned out or dimming exterior light bulbs.
- ✓ Change flashlight and weather alert radio
