OUC's Stanton Energy Center to Be Home to First Solar Farm in Orange County



OUC will begin construction this month on the county's first solar farm at the Curtis H. Stanton Energy Center in east Orange County. The solar farm will add to an already diverse fleet of clean, reliable generation at OUC's 3,280-acre Stanton Energy Center, which is home to natural gas, landfill gas and coal.

The 6 Megawatt solar photovoltaic (PV) array is expected to generate enough renewable energy to power more than 600 homes. OUC, which partnered with Duke Energy and Regenesys Power LLC to install, operate and maintain the system, plans to purchase that power for the next 20 years.

"The solar farm not only increases OUC's portfolio of clean generation, it also provides the opportunity to study the

impact a large-scale solar array will have on our electric distribution system," said OUC Board President Maylen Dominguez.

OUC customers who travel along Innovation Way will be able to see the solar generation that will be providing renewable energy to their homes and businesses. The more than 25,000 PV modules covering nearly 45 acres of land will be easily visible from the road when the project is completed later this year.

The solar panels will feature a patented single-axis tracking system that increases electricity output by up to 30 percent and can withstand hurricane-force winds in the stow position.

its effectiveness. Injected wall foam fixes those problems by better insulating the rooms that you want.



The process involves injecting liquid foam behind walls and allowing it to expand to completely fill the cavity behind the wall. The insulation inhibits mold and maintains its insulating value over time. And because the wall foam is inert, it makes your home more fire resistant, so home insurance costs may decline as your energy savings rise.

The tampering fees have been increased to:

- \$200 for a first offense
- \$400 for a second offense
- \$800 for a third offense or more



In addition to increased tampering fees, individuals will be charged for all past unauthorized/unmetered consumption, damaged equipment and associated labor. OUC also may pursue civil action. OUC Offers Rebate For High Performance Windows

Central Florida's sunny climate heats up homes, forcing air conditioners to work longer and harder to keep you comfortable. High-performance windows keep the sun out of your home while maximizing your views of the great outdoors and keeping your energy costs under control.

High-performance windows have a Solar Heat-Gain Coefficient of 0.4 to 0.6, the lower the better. To help you see the benefits of these advanced windows, OUC recently increased the rebate to \$2 per square foot of glass, up to \$500. If you buy before December 31, 2011, a federal tax credit equal to 10 percent of the product cost for the purchase (but not installation) of high-performance windows is also available.
