Kitchen Tips For an Energy-Efficient Holiday Season



The holidays provide love, laughs and a lot of time in the kitchen. Here are a few ways to keep spirits high and energy bills low:

- Resist the temptation to open the oven door to peek at what's cooking. Most modern ovens are equipped with a tempered glass window, so simply turn on the oven light and peek through the glass. That's what it's there for!
- Don't be afraid to cook several dishes in the oven at the same time. Just leave enough room for heat to circulate around each dish.
- Clean your stovetop burners and reflectors regularly. This allows them to distribute heat more efficiently and save energy.
- Consider using your microwave as much as possible. Fast and efficient microwaves use nearly 50 percent less energy than conventional ovens.
- Since turkeys and hams typically slow roast for hours, there's no need to preheat the oven in advance.
- Keep your freezer and refrigerator doors closed as much as possible. These appliances are among the largest energy consumers in your home, often accounting for as much as 15 percent of your total usage!

OUC Contractor to Inspect Electric Poles

As part of our continued commitment to reliability, OUC will begin routine visual inspections of electric pole equipment in the St. Cloud area, requiring front and rear lot access for some homes. OUC has hired Davey Resource Group to help with these inspections. In the coming months, inspectors who require outdoor access to properties will be wearing a Davey Resource Group/OUC identification badge and their vehicles will be marked with "OUC Contractor" placards.

Make a list and check it twice

- ✓ Inspect strands of holiday lights before you put them up. To prevent fires, discard any strands with frayed or loose wires.
- ✓ Use decorative lights rated for "indoor" and "outdoor" only in those designated areas.
- ✓ Turn off all decorations before you leave home or go to bed.
- ✓ Keep candles away from trees and draperies, and never leave lit candles unattended.
- ✓ Be careful not to overload extension cords and electrical outlets.
- ✓ Consider switching to LED lights. They're more efficient and significantly reduce the risk of fire.
