



OUC Electric Billing Adjustments

Effective October 1, 2018

To allow for enhanced rate options in the future, OUC will restructure the way it charges customers for electricity usage, effective October 1, 2018.

Residential fuel prices will decrease 8 percent offsetting a \$2.00 increase in the electric service charge and an adjustment in non-fuel base prices. These changes will allow the total monthly bill for residential customers using 1,000 kilowatt hours to remain at \$106.

General Service Non-Demand (small commercial) customers will see a similar fuel price decrease of 8 percent offset by a change in the monthly service charge from \$10.25 to \$12.25 and an adjustment to the non-fuel base price.

Residential Electric Rate Schedule

General Service Non-Demand Rate Schedule

Effective 10/1/2018

Electric Service Charge	\$12.25 per month
Non-Fuel Base Charge	6.765 cents/kWh
Fuel Charge	3.349 cents/kWh

Electric Service Charge: Fixed monthly charge covering basic costs of meter reading and billing, plus maintenance of services and meters.



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Non-Fuel Base Charge: All other costs of providing electric service except fuel and purchased power costs.

Fuel Charge: The costs of fuel and purchased power incurred by OUC to provide electric service to customers.

Terms of Payment: A late charge of 1.5% will be charged on all past due balances for non-government accounts. Bills are due and payable upon receipt and become past due approximately 20 days after the bill date. A late fee is assessed on the total unpaid past due amount five (5) days after the due date. Actual disconnection of the service takes place approximately 16 days after the past due date if the account is still unpaid.

Limitations: This electric service is not available for resale or partial, standby and supplemental service.

Municipal Tax: A Municipal Tax is applied to the charge for electric service provided to customers within the jurisdictional limits of each municipal or other governmental body imposing a utility tax on such service. The Municipal Tax shall be determined in accordance with the governmental body's utility tax ordinance, and the amount collected by OUC from the Municipal Tax shall be remitted to the governmental body in the manner required by law. No Municipal Tax shall apply to fuel charges in excess of 0.638¢/kWh.

State Taxes: In accordance with Section 203.01 of the Florida Statutes, a gross receipts tax is applicable to electric sales charges. General Service (commercial) electric customers are subject to state sales tax unless a certificate of tax exemption has been filed with OUC.
