Plan ahead with tips from Erin Givens, OUC Vegetation Management Specialist

- Visualize your planting area beforehand and allow enough space for your plants to grow to their full potential.
- Select the right plant by considering the amount of sunlight, soil conditions, nearest water source, and location of above ground and/or buried utilities.
- Call 811 before you dig. OUC will mark your underground utilities for free.
- Any trees planted within 20 feet of an overhead utility line should have a maximum height of less than 20 feet.
- Conserve natural resources by following the rules of xeriscaping or Florida-Friendly Landscaping.



MAKE EVERY DROP COUNT FOR WATER CONSERVATION MONTH

DO

- Repair leaking faucets and toilets
- Take shorter showers
- Fully load dishwasher and washing machine

DON'T

- Run water while brushing teeth or shaving
- Dump water — give your plants what your family and pets leave behind
- Flush trash down the toilet

Save Money This Summer!

Warmer weather is on the way. Keep energy costs under control with these simple tricks:

Set your thermostat at 78 degrees

The efficiency "sweet spot" for most AC units. When you leave, turn it up to 85 degrees or higher. You'll save 6-8 percent for each degree you raise the setting.

Change or clean AC filters monthly

Check the air handler and ductwork for leaks and place weather-stripping or caulk around windows, doors, plumbing and other gaps.

Keep the heat out

Close your curtains, mini-blinds, or shutters.

Install ceiling fans

With cool air circulating, you can raise your thermostat several degrees and not notice the difference. Just remember to turn fans off in unoccupied areas.
