MAY IS NATIONAL ELECTRICAL SAFETY MONTH

Making Safety First is OUC's number one company value.

During National Electrical Safety Month, we're sharing safety precautions you can follow around your home to keep your family safe all year round.



- Always install the proper bulb with the appropriate wattage for fixtures, lamps or other devices.
- Regularly inspect electrical cords and extension cords for damage.
- Repair or replace any appliance that repeatedly blows a fuse, trips a circuit, or causes an electric shock.
- Protect children and pets by covering unused wall outlets with plastic safety caps.
- Never remove the third prong of a threepronged plug. The third prong is designed to safely ground electricity.
- Test smoke alarms monthly, change batteries yearly and replace units every 10 years.

OUTDOOR SAFETY TIPS

- Call 8-1-1 before you dig. Many utility lines are buried underground.
- Always keep tools, objects and yourself at least 10 feet away from overhead power lines.
- Keep children and pets a safe distance away when you operate a mower, chainsaw or other power equipment.
- Don't use electrical tools or appliances in the rain, on wet surfaces or while standing in water.
- Use only weather-resistant, heavy-gauge extension cords marked "For Outdoor Use."
- Don't overload outdoor electrical and/or extension cords or allow them to run through water on the ground.

IT'S BALD EAGLE NESTING SEASON AT OUC'S STANTON ENERGY CENTER

OUC continuously places importance on protecting the environment. These efforts include awareness and protection around animal habitats. OUC's Stanton Energy Center (SEC) includes an 1,800-acre nature preserve that is home to many species including deer, bobcats, tortoises, cranes and more.

A mating pair of bald eagles has nested in the habitat for years. This past month, the pair was spotted with an eaglet. Bald eagles typically return to the same nest annually.

OUC's wildlife biologist monitors the eagles and also conducts a biannual



census of red-cockaded woodpeckers at SEC. Endangered due to habitat loss since 1970, the woodpeckers nest in the preserve's longleaf pines. The census is mandated by law and helps track their population. Currently their numbers at SEC are estimated at 27, which has more than doubled since 2009.

5 TIPS TO PLANT THE RIGHT TREE AT THE RIGHT PLACE

It's spring and that means gardening. Before you begin, Erin Givens, OUC's Vegetation Program Manager, offers five essential tips for planting the right tree in the right place.

- **1** Choose wisely: Consider the tree's long-term growth and height to fit your landscape.
- **2 Plant carefully:** Avoid power line interference by selecting trees under 15 feet tall.
- 3 Dial before you dig: Check for buried utilities before starting any excavation.
- **Clear around equipment:** Keep electric areas free of vegetation for easy access.
- **3** Stay clear of power lines: Maintain a 10-foot distance for safety.
