## Keep Your Utility Bill In Check This Summer With OUC's Usage Dashboard

As high temperatures bear down on Central Florida, OUC's Usage Dashboard can help you understand how hot weather impacts your bill, so you can keep your cool and your cash during the hot summer months. The online tool allows you to monitor your electric consumption to see the days and times you use the most, as well as corresponding high and low temperatures, making it easy to adjust your habits and save money. You can even set email alerts to be sent to your inbox when usage numbers reach a specific threshold.

To view your Usage Dashboard, simply log in to your myOUC Online Profile and click the blue *View Usage*

button under *Account Summary*. The dashboard will open in a new window, so be sure to set your browser to allow pop-ups.

## Back To School Conservation Tips

With the kids headed back to school, take advantage of that empty house and follow these energy saving tips to get your wallet back in check:

- 1 **Raise Your Thermostat** – When there's no one to keep cool in your home, raise your thermostat a few degrees so the A/C runs less.
- 2 **Unplug Unused Devices** – All those TVs and game systems can eat up energy even when they're not in use. So, keep them unplugged for ultimate energy efficiency.
- 3 **Keep Drapes/Blinds Closed** – Keeping drapes and blinds closed can help keep the sun's heat out



of your home so the A/C doesn't need to work as hard.

- 4 **Install Lighting Timers** – Don't leave your lights on all day just so the house will be lit when you get home. Instead, install timers on lamps so they kick on right before you're scheduled to arrive.
- 5 **Keep the Fridge Closed** – When you're packing lunches, don't leave the refrigerator door open. Remove all the items you need before you start assembling.
