SECOND RATE DECREASE APPROVED

Total net average savings of \$15/month for OUC 1,000 kWh residential customers.

In August, OUC–The *Reliable* One's Board of Commissioners voted to decrease the electric retail price by 1.5%. The average residential customer using 1,000-kilowatt hours can expect savings of approximately \$2/month in Orlando/ Orange County and \$2.08/month in St. Cloud/Osceola County.

This is the second electric decrease in just four months, for a total net average savings of \$15/month for OUC 1,000 kWh residential customers.

The decrease will take effect

The decrease will take effect October 1, 2023, pending PSC approval.

MAKING EV CHARGING MORE ACCESSIBLE THROUGHOUT ORLANDO

The grand opening of the Robinson Recharge Mobility Hub in downtown Orlando on July 25 signaled a giant leap forward in OUC's efforts to increase electric vehicle (EV) use as part of its pledge to reduce CO2 emissions.

The site, located at 129 W Robinson Street, includes six 240-kilowatt (kW) and 14 120kW Level 3-rated chargers capable of recharging all makes of EVs. Recharge hubs help reduce concerns EV drivers may have about finding a convenient location to charge.

The \$2.9 million project was partly funded by a \$500,000 grant that partners OUC, Power Electronics, the City of Orlando and Orange County secured from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.
