Water Only Once A Week Starting Nov. 1

Get ready to switch to watering your lawn and garden just one day a week. Starting November 1, homes with odd numbered or no addresses may water only on Saturdays, while those with even numbered addresses may water on Sundays. Non-residential (commercial, public or industrial) properties may water only on Tuesdays. Water only when needed for no more than one hour and not between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

The seasonal rules from the St. Johns River Water Management District are designed to ensure the efficient use of water for landscape irrigation while allowing enough water to maintain healthy yards year-round. During Daylight Saving Time, which begins the second Sunday in March, the water schedule will return to two days a week.

MAKE YOUR MARK: Protect Your Home and Wallet from the Sun

You've invested thousands of dollars in your home's carpets and furniture. But did you know that the sun's UV rays can drain the color from your home's interior furnishings? The sun also makes your house hotter, forcing your air conditioner to work harder to keep you comfortable. Many Central Floridians pay \$100 or more per month to cool their homes, but window film could cut those costs by 25 percent or more.

Window film keeps nearly all of the sun's UV rays out of your home, which preserves your view, cuts down on glare, extends the life and color of your furnishings and lowers your utility bill. Window film is widely available at home improvement stores across Central Florida and takes 30 minutes or less to install on each window.

Not a do-it-yourselfer? Check with a local handyman service or the home improvement store for references to qualified installers. Window film is eligible for a 30 percent federal tax credit, up to \$1,500 (excluding the cost of installation), if purchased by December 31,



2010. And OUC is doing our part with a rebate of up to \$100 on the purchase of window film or a solar screen. Make an investment today to preserve your home's furnishings and keep your home more comfortable at a lower cost. Learn more at www.ouc.com.



SAFETY TIPS



Look Up First

Remember to look up when working near overhead power lines. If you think power lines may interfere with your work, call OUC at **407.823.9150** at least two business days before starting the job. OUC can explain the safest way to perform the work.

Call Before You Dig

Before beginning any excavation work, call Sunshine State One-Call at **800.432.4770** to determine where underground pipes and electric lines are located. Law requires diggers to call this number at least two days before starting excavation, whether it's a project involving heavy equipment or a simple landscaping job.

Downed Lines Can Be Deadly

Stay away from downed power lines and call OUC immediately at **407.823.9150** to report them. Always assume the downed line is energized and never touch or try to move it. If anyone comes in contact with a downed line, don't attempt to rescue them. Instead call **9.1.1** immediately and wait for OUC and emergency personnel to respond.
