<u>ORDER</u>

The Court entered an amended Case Management and Scheduling Order on February 14, 2020. (Doc. 107 ("CMSO").) Plaintiffs move to extend the deadlines related to class certification for ninety days due to COVID-19. (Doc. 119 ("**Motion**").) Defendants oppose but agree to a thirty-day extension of all CMSO deadlines. (Docs. 122–25.) On review, a thirty-day extension of all deadlines adequately addresses the complications caused by COVID-19, as Plaintiffs had time before the pandemic to prepare their class certification materials.

It is ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

 Plaintiffs' Motion to Extend Case Deadlines (Doc. 119) is GRANTED IN PART AND DENIED IN PART:

- a. The deadlines in the CMSO (Doc. 107) that have not yet passed areEXTENDED by thirty (30) days.
- b. In all other respects, the Motion is **DENIED**.
- 2. The Court will issue an amended CMSO reflecting the new deadlines.
