Number of Days 31

Rainfall and temperature readings are recorded by the National Weather Service (NWS) at Orlando International Airport (MCO). Normal is an average over the 1995-2009 period. Departure is an amount above or below normal. A DEGREE-DAY is the difference between a particular day's mean (average of maximum and minimum) temperature and a base temperature of 65 deg. F. One COOLING DEGREE-DAY (CDD) is counted for each degree higher than this base, and one HEATING DEGREE-DAY (HDD) is counted for each degree lower. Normal weather values reflect the entire month.
