Generator Safety Tips to Get You Through a Storm

- Never plug a generator directly into your home; it can re-energize power lines and endanger utility crews working on restoring power to your area.
- Install a transfer switch before a storm hits.
- Place generators outside, away from windows and doors, to prevent carbon monoxide buildup.
- Turn off and let a gas-powered generator cool before refueling.
- Keep a fully charged fire extinguisher nearby.
- Never use a generator in wet conditions.
- Keep children and pets away from generators.
